The discussions also focused on the recent launch of the Hiridjee Higher Education Loan Scheme's progress, challenges, and potential growth areas. The exchange rate and its impact on loan repayment were one of the primary issues that were raised.

Members of the Khoja (Pirhai) Shia Isna Asheri Jamaat (KPSIAJ) committee who were present promised to develop a long-term sustainable strategy to address this issue. 20 Khoja students have benefited from the Hiridjee loan programme so far, and a few more applications are currently being processed.

The WF's stipend and assistance programmes for Khoja students in Hawza were also highlighted.

Visit to the Fatimiyah Education Network

The WF Delegation visited the Fatimiyah Schools on August 22, 2022 and assessed first hand some of the support it provides to the school. The tour began with the Year 11 and 12 (Intermediate Level) classes before moving on to the primary and secondary school for boys, Fatimiyah Boys School. The delegation also went to the Fatimiyah Girls and Montessori Schools. The Qur'anic lesson curriculum and its teaching was also shared and appreciated.

"It was extremely inspirational and serves as a global example for how schooling and lessons from the Holy Qur'an, through interactive learning and stories, can be incorporated into the school curriculum. To observe first hand how Godly and moral stories from the Qur'an are taught to our children during their formative years was extremely powerful. I am certain these lessons will be very useful during their entire lives", said Arifali Hirji, The WF Secretary General.















They continued on to the Fatimiyah Sports Centre, where the team got the chance to see the varied sporting amenities available to both Karachi's Khoja population and school children.



The community may make use of the many packages offered. It was pleasing to note the indoor sports hall, gym, and pool facilities for the benefit of the community. Great enthusiasm of The WF delegates when seeing and hearing about community's engagement around the Fatimiyah (Khoja) park.

The robustness in infrastructure, eg that the the facilities can be accessed with digitalised membership cards, was impressive.

The WF also provides monthly support to the most deserving cases requiring medical assistance at the hospital.

Visit to Madina Ahlebait, Skardu

The WF Delegates continued their journey in Pakistan on Thursday, 24th August 2022, towards Skardu located in Baltistan Province of Pakistan. They primarily visited the USWA Madina Ahlebait school for Boys and Girls, a welfare institution that caters for more than 600 children. A needs assessment was conducted, establishing a dire need for support, such as classroom furniture, course books, uniforms, etc. The WF currently sponsors 240 students at the school.













The delegation then visited the site of WF-AID's Flagship Ali Asghar Water Appeal Project for 2021. With the installation of a sizable water tank, a project that was completed in collaboration with Stanmore Jafferys, more than 140 homes in the residential complex are now regularly supplied with drinking-quality water. The team then met a few beneficiaries and observed the food packs and its distribution process where 100 families in the Madina Ahlebait residential complex are supported every month. These include orphans, widows, disabled people, and senior citizens who have no/or very limited means.


Visit to Pakistan Polytechnical Institute, Skardu

This two year diploma course will enable them to work as certified pharmacy technicians and can even run their own medical store. Sponsorship of deserving students was also discussed.

IISLAMABAD

USWA College for Boys

The WF Delegates travelled to Islamabad on Friday, 26th August 2022, to continue their visits and carry out further needs assessments. The USWA College was their first site of visit in Islamabad. The institution was established in 2003 and with 362 students, and offers boarding accommodations for students from Gilgit, Baltistan, Parchinar, and other nearby regions. Despite coming from poor situations, these students perform well in academics. They lack the resources to pursue college education in the places where they reside.



The WF representatives visited the principal, vice principal, and a few teachers to learn more about the school's operations, activities, difficulties, and shortcomings. The WF will explore opportunities for collaboration and student funding.



The delegation participated in the annual "Husayn Day" programme at the boys school. Alhaj Safder Jaffer - The WF President, and Shaykh Nadir Jaffer - Head of The WF External Tableegh, addressed the audience. Alhaj Arifali Hirji - The WF Secretary General, was requested to deliver a youth oriented talk geared on "A Successful Husayni - inspired by Hadhrat Abbas (a)".

USWA Boys and Girls' School Dhudial - Chakwal

The delegation next drove for two hours to Dhudial, Chakwal District in Punjab, to visit the USWA Boys and Girls Schools. Students at all of these institutions receive support through the Zainabiya Child Sponsorship Scheme (ZCSS) programme, and they consistently achieve excellent results.

One of the first projects under ZCSS in Pakistan was the support given to the USWA Boys College, where 12 boys are currently funded. The difficulties managing the boys hostel were discussed, and a proposal was made to expand the student scholarship programme.
